

Having left Ireland at the age of 18 without an explanation to her family, Winnie has spent years in the UK where she worked as a nurse met and married her husband PJ, an African man that came to the UK as a refugee when his village was attacked and wiped out.

Unexpectedly, Winnie sees her brother Jimboy being interviewed on TV about the council's plan to move the family. As she is now ill with cancer, she realises that she has unfinished business with her family and to Ireland and revisit her past in order to make things right for the future of her family.

Jimboy agrees to meet with Winnie where they try to connect with each other, her aunty Sheila is brought along to keep Jimboy in order as he is too angry with Winnie. After Winnie discloses that she left because she was attacked and raped following a Traveller's feud, Winnie goes on to explain that she had a child from the rape who her husband raised as their own.

Jimboy is tasked with the job of getting his father Daddy Jim to come around to meeting with Winnie. Daddy Jim is set on revenge. Himself and Jimboy set out to find the culprit and make him pay for his actions.

Winnie's story is further complicated by the fact two of her children are mixed race and she has not told them that she is a member of the Traveller community. Winnie's eldest son is now thrown into confusion as he is in love with a traveller girl and as he doesn't know that he is a Traveller. It all comes at its conclusion at the church on the day of his wedding and once again the family are brought together and the healing can start.
